ISLAMABAD: With over 50,000 households affected by the intense floods in the ongoing season, the Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF) allocated Rs250 million for Flood Emergency Relief Programme to provide immediate life-saving assistance in the worst affected districts. An estimated 115,000 people in need will benefit across 8 districts in all four provinces from the humanitarian response. The relief package will include a diversity of need-based interventions including temporary shelters, food ration packs, hygiene kits, water purification tablets, medical supplies, livestock vaccination and other items of need for the flood victims. PPAF will work with its local partners organisations already present in the affected areas to deliver the emergency response.

Explaining rationale of the response, PPAF Chief Operating Officer Nadir Gul Barech said, "PPAF has always been at the forefront of relief and rehabilitation efforts and has benefited over 11.6 million people over the years during the 2005 earthquake, the 2010 floods and COVID-19 pandemic. 
