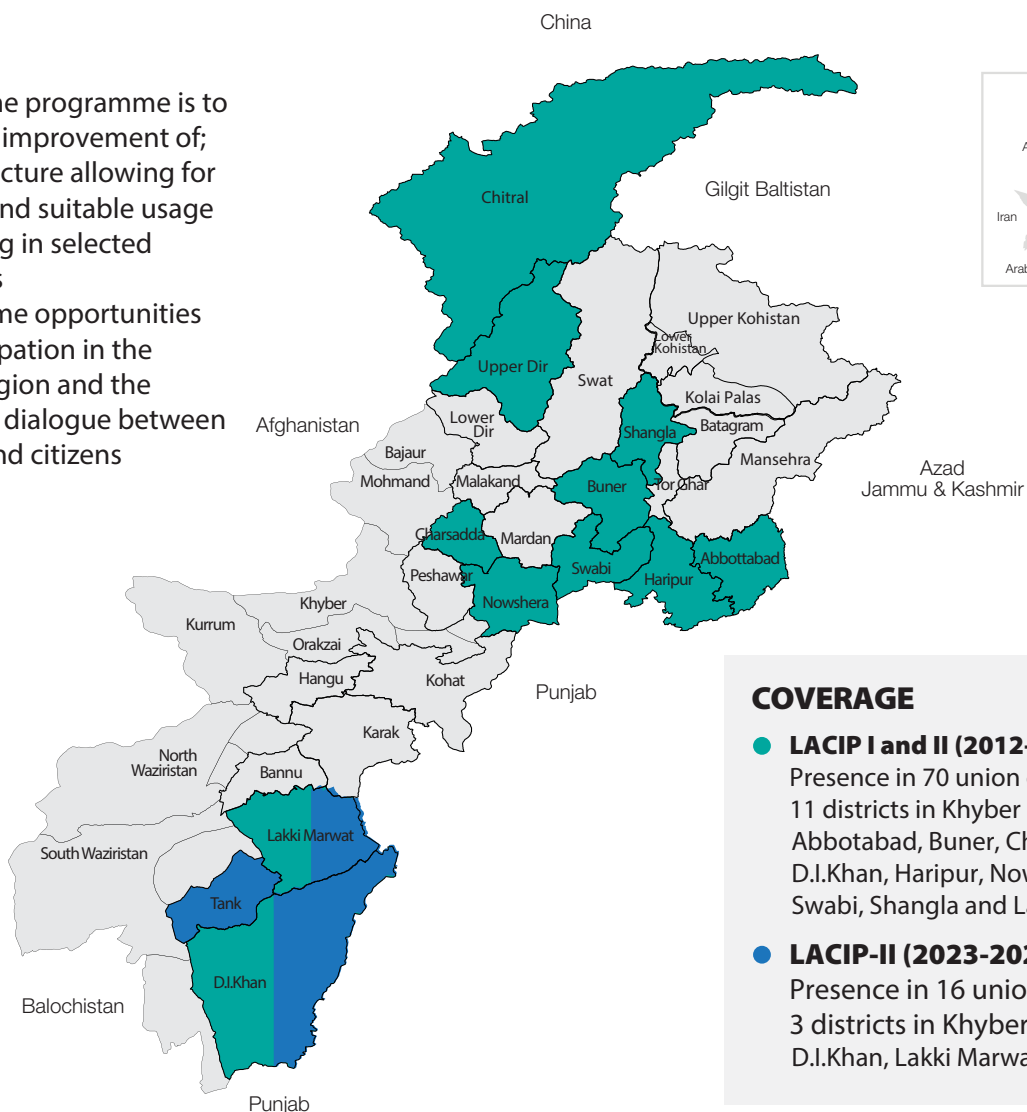
LACIP is an integrated poverty reduction programme funded by Federal Republic of Germany through KfW that aims to contribute towards the improvement of living conditions of vulnerable communities by building disaster-resilient Community Physical Infrastructure (CPI) and generating employability through Livelihood Enhancement and Protection interventions with Institutional Development as the basis for all the activities. PPAF is the lead implementing agency of LACIP through its Partner Organisations (POs).

OBJECTIVES

The purpose of the programme is to contribute to the improvement of;

- Public infrastructure allowing for better access and suitable usage by people living in selected project regions
- Access to income opportunities
- Political participation in the programme region and the stepping up of dialogue between government and citizens



COVERAGE

● LACIP I and II (2012-2022)

Presence in 70 union councils of 11 districts in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Abbottabad, Buner, Charsadda, Chitral, D.I.Khan, Haripur, Nowshera, Upper Dir, Swabi, Shangla and Lakki Marwat

● LACIP-II (2023-2026)

Presence in 16 union councils of 3 districts in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. D.I.Khan, Lakki Marwat and Tank

LACIP-II (2023-2026)

In view of the devastation caused by floods in 2022 in programme districts of LACIP and adjacent areas i.e., D.I Khan, Tank and Lakki Marwat, KfW has committed EUR 9.5 million as an additional grant under LACIP II for the implementation of rehabilitation works in three districts. This additional grant is to finance three components.

- Institutional Development (ID)
- Community Physical Infrastructure (CPI)
- Livelihoods Enhancement and Protection (LEP)

The project is aimed to:

- Reconstruct/rebuild around 100 Climate Resilient Infrastructure Projects / Integrated Area Upgradation Projects (IAUPs) to rehabilitate, enhance, and reconstruct infrastructure thereby contributing to the integrated upgradation of the selected project area.
- Awareness and capacity-building training of 5,000 persons under Institutional Development, along with formation/ revitalisation of community organisations and development of gender-inclusive Village Development Plans (VDP) focused on the individual community's climate resilience.
- Skills training of 2,000 women/men in vocational and technical areas, ideally related to climate change & adaptation and provision of livelihood opportunities through group-based approach.

LACIP I and II (2012-2022)

LACIP has been implemented from January 2012 to December 2022. The project was mandated to work in Institutional Development (ID) as a foundation and to create an integrated approach towards development through implementing small and large-scale Community Physical Infrastructure (CPI) schemes, improving Health and Education (H&E) facilities, uplifting the economic condition of local communities through Livelihood Enhancement and Protection (LEP), and execute Disaster Preparedness and Mitigation (DPM) interventions. This project has improved the general living conditions of poor households, reduced their vulnerability to disasters, increased income-generating opportunities, and imparted good governance by linking local communities with local governments in 11 districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa..
